For many of us, the idea of collecting fossils when we were kids has never diminished through the years. I remember the idea of finding dinosaur bones in

the backyard. Piecing it back together and putting it on display at a famous museum. Well, the truth of the matter is, that will not happen to you, unless you live in Utah or its neighboring states.



Don't be discouraged though. Why would you settle for fossils that are a mere 65 mya (and require massive excavating) when you can find fossils (with minimal ease) that are over 350 million years old !!! Hundreds of million years before the dinosaurs

dominated the landscape, invertebrate life was evolving in the Paleozoic seas of Pangaea. Today over 95% of the species across the globe are invertebrates; leaving behind a rich fossil history to explore!

Junior Club Members, with adventure guide Kurt Brinks, will explore and touch real fossils of ancient elephants to help us discover more about these extinct mammals.


Can you tell the difference between a Mastodon and a Mammoth tooth? What do their teeth tell us about what they ate?
