# Galena Mineralization In Missippi Valley Type Deposits Special Guest: Dr. Renee Sparks

# We all missed the February meeting due to poor weather. We are so happy to have this second chance to hear Dr. Sparks speak about Missouri geology.

Join us as we venture outside of Michigan geology "We'll take a tour into the Precambrian igneous rocks as the source of economic metals including lead, zinc, and copper. From there we'll step through the Lamotte Sandstone, a Cambrian aged sedimentary rock overlying a billion-year gap in the geologic record. Finally, we'll dive into the Cambrian and Ordovician dolostones that host the Mississippi Valley Type massive sulfide deposits, to examine their emplacement and strategies for extraction." - Dr. Sparks

A professor of mineralogy and petrology at Hope and Calvin Colleges, Dr. Sparks shares her passion outside of the classroom leading field trips to the St. Francois Mountains. TCGMC members may also know Dr. Sparks as the Director of the Bruce Dice Mineralogical Museum, one of our more recent club field trip destinations thanks to an invitation from the Indian Mounds club.


