



# Facinating Faceting - Is it for You?!

If you have spent any time in our demonstrators corner at the show then you probably met Eric Peterson! We are excited to have him as our guest speaker this month. Eric has been a Tulip City member since 2014. He is one of the earliest members of the White River club and a member of the Midwest Faceters Guild, as well as an alumni of the Gemological Institute of America. Members will gain insight to the basics: tools, machines and how to select and purchase rough material. 

#### SHOW DISPLAY CASES

Sign up for a case at the August meeting so you can display some of the specimens you have collected. The theme is totally up to you! Below are the case sizes we have available...

Pony case - 48" wide x 24" deep x 24" high (the most common case we have)

Flat case - 24" wide x 30" deep x 5" - 8" tapered height and a glass lid

#### ~ Important tips for a great display ~

- 1 Clearly label your specimens, what, and where from. Also identify yourself and your theme.
- 2 Use a liner in your case, lay it out in advance, and take a picture to make it easier to recreate on site.
- 3 Once it's "installed" clean your case front, bring cleaner and paper towels.
- 4 Protect your collection. Bring a small padlock, keyed or combination.

One of our clubs primary goals is to educate ourselves and others about our wonderful hobby. Your case will be a great part of that process.

#### You must be a member of Tulip City Gem & Mineral Club to sell at the marketplace






#### ~ Thunder Bay Amethyst Field Trip ~

The Thunder Bay Amethyst field trip occurred the week of June 19th-23rd. Field trip attendees traveled up to Thunder Bay at various times prior to the start of the event with several stopping to collect along the way.

Monday morning the group met at the Blue Point Amethyst mine where we were graciously hosted by the mine owner Jordan Vivian. This is the first year with Jordan as owner and he was a wonderful host. As this was a rock club event we were allowed access to the mine pit itself and not just the tailing piles. He reserved the whole week for us in the pit with no other people or groups allowed into the mine but us and we were the first group into the mine pit this year.

The next day, we were off to the Diamond Willow Amethyst mine. Interestingly enough, the Diamond Willow shares part of the same mine pit with the Blue Point Amethyst mine. We could only hunt in the tailing piles at Diamond Willow, but still some good discoveries were made.



On Wednesday, we visited the Panorama Mine. This mine, again only allowed hunting in the tailing piles. One of the items the Panorama is known for is their giant amethyst points of which several were found







After collecting at both the Diamond Willow and Panorama mines, several people once again went back to the Blue Point Amethyst mine since we had access to the pit for the full week. The group spread out for the rest of the week with some heading home, collecting along the

### ~ Ishpeming Rock Show & Field Trip ~

Several Tulip City and White River Rock Club rock hounds once again crossed the Mighty Mac the first week of August to collect at various mine sites and attend the Ishpeming Club show! Some also went on to Keweenaw for more adventures, but that is their story to tell.

Having never been to the Republic Mine and learning too late last year that the Ishpeming Club's once a year field trip was the ONLY time the public can collect there, I made a special effort to attend. For \$10, we were allowed to collect as much as we (and our vehicles!) could carry from 2 different locations in the huge mine site. What did we find? Banded iron formation with hematite and Jasper, specular hematite, taconite, magnetite, and even small garnets!! Lovely material, much of it glittering and shining in the sun on our bright, sunny day and very HEAVY. Footing can also be challenging, as the rock piles shift and slip.

After a quick picnic lunch at the nearby campground, 7 of us went on to the Champion Mine site known especially for specular hematite. I had not realized there are several piles of material throughout the site, and was interested to discover some new locations. Thankfully, it was not quite as sunny as earlier, as the road and piles can be quite blinding with the glitter from the hematite! Mama Mia's, a long established local Italian restaurant, did not disappoint for dinner.

Saturday brought the Ishpeming Show, with its vendors, silent auction, evening cracker barrel and live auction of many remarkable, exceptional specimens. The silent auction presented many local pieces which could often be won with very reasonable bids. Vendors, including an agate guy with an amazing amount of agates at varying prices, offered different material than we always see here downstate, although there were also many familiar faces.


Between the show and the cracker barrel, 6 of us went to the Ropes Gold Mine site to collect the green antique verde. (And any gold we might have found!  $\Box$ ). The gate was unlocked, so we drove in which was nice because it is about a half mile walk to the site, and the material becomes heavier and heavier on the way back. However, when we came back, the lock was on and we about panicked! Fortunately, it was not on securely and we were able to escape. We did find lots of the pretty green antique verde, and other material in a nearby field and rock pile. It is worth the hike, even if I would not trust driving in again.

The speaker at the Cracker Barrel spoke very technically on rifts and tectonic plates, and has a new book published on the topic. Peter was able to obtain several stunning pieces in the live auction, including a fascinating piece of fossilized coral—ask him about it when you see him....

Sunday for me included breakfast with Deb and Rick Smith at the famous "Sherrie's," a local diner with good food, but focused on the long drive home, with rock stops in Marquette and Petoskey for a little variety and breaks. All in all, it was a great time, made all the better by being able to share the experience with great rockhounding pals! Thanks Deb, Rick, Peter, Pam, Bambi, Chuck, Vern, Brenda, Mike and Robin! Hope you all had as good a time as I did!
